# Interview

An interview with the academic team will form part of the admissions criteria for entry onto the course.

There will be no tour of the facilities as we recommend that you attend an [Open Day](#) to visit the campus and accommodation, and meet the lecturers on a separate occasion.

Based on your academic profile, you will be invited for an interview on one of the two dates we have set up for this year.

During the interview, you will be able to demonstrate in a **portfolio that you will bring and that we can keep** good physical fitness, and **animal handling skills experience** (canine- equine- farm animal/other species) corresponding to at least:

- 150h for equine
- 100h for canine
- 50h for farm animal/other species

Under the supervision of various providers.

In the portfolio, we want to see **evidence of your placements**, if the placements are done prior to the interview (letters from the providers stating the date and length of the placements, the animal handling activities undertaken and the skills developed) during the interview. If the placements have not been done prior to the interview, letters from the providers stating the date and length of the coming placements must be submitted during the interview.

All placements must have been effective before the beginning of the course.

Placement must be less than three years old to be taken into consideration.

Owning a dog or a horse does not constitute evidence of practical handling.

**Evidence of other activity** related to practical handling (competition, pony club, BHS qualification...) should also be copied and added to the portfolio as evidence.

**As the portfolio will be kept, please ensure that you provide only COPIES of the evidence.**

We also expect that **you provide a non-edited 5mn video of you putting a bridle on horse.**

Please provide the video on **your phone**. No comments are necessary on the video but it is imperative that we can identify you.

The examiner will look at the video on your phone **whilst you will be asked to complete a short math test.**

You will not need a calculator to do the test.

After that, a conversation, with more formal questions, will be taking place.
