

Personal safety

The UK is generally a safe country and Writtle and the surrounding area is a very safe place to live in but there are some basic rules everyone should follow to stay safe.

Be cautious of strangers

- Although you may be keen to make new friends, be cautious of people you do not know, whatever their nationality
- Do not give people your personal details, money or property if you have only just met them
- Your friends, the College or other responsible person should always know where you are. **Tell them if you are meeting someone new or going away**.

Do not walk on your own in secluded areas at night

- You should always ask a friend to accompany you across campus at night and where possible use pathways that are lit.
 If this is not possible and particularly if you are worried a college warden may also be able to assist you. Outside of normal office hours they can be contacted on 07880 557796.
- To get back to your college from the Chelmsford town centre at night, take a licensed taxi.
- If you do not have the money to pay, ask the taxi driver to take you to a cash point and wait whilst you withdraw some money.

Do not accept lifts in cars from people you do not know

- In the UK you should not hitch a ride or accept the offer of a lift from someone you do not know
- If a car slows down to ask you if you would like a lift, step back from the car you are not being rude but keeping yourself safe

Do not carry large amounts of cash

- Do not keep large amounts of cash on you or unsecured in your study bedroom
- Valuables and money should be kept in your bedroom safe
- Try to transfer your money to the UK electronically via a bank or by using a bank draft
- Take care when you use your PIN, for example, at ATMs

Drink aware

- Have fun but don't drink **too** much and try to **plan ahead**. You should **always know how you're getting home**, and arrange to go **with a friend**.
- Sadly drink 'spiking' with drugs does happen. Keep an eye on your drink and never leave it unattended. Be careful if
 accepting drinks from strangers. If what you're experiencing really doesn't seem like the effects of alcohol tell a friend
 straight away.
